Building the capacity to forge a national development strategy poses special challenges when emerging from conflict. Facing continuing international isolation and political fragmentation, Serbian reformers used the EU accession process as a way to set goals and help ministries build the practices necessary to follow up.

Beginning in 2007, Serbia enacted a series of unilateral measures to carry out the internal conversations required. These steps and others helped build the basis for a future, broad-based national discussion of aspirations and priorities. [Read more.](#)
